HF CONDITIONS: The last two weeks have shown a remarkable increase in HF conditions on the higher bands. Sunspot numbers have been ranging between 20-55 and the flux in the 80s. I have always believed that there is no 1:1 relationship between sunspots/solar flux and conditions. There appears to be another factor which we are yet to discover. But one thing is sure. Many hams get on the band or not looking at the figures which in turn affect activity. After all sunspots or no spots take an ARRL or some important DX contest weekend and the bands come alive. My advice is; get on the air please and you will soon find the "conditions" that seem not to be there!! It is like people not spending during recession resulting in the recovery taking longer!!! If you listen between 1500-2000z you will hear 4S7RO(SSB/CW), 7NE(CW), 7NC, 6ABC, 6RAV, 7VK(SSB/CW), 7KM(CW) generating pretty huge pile ups. Congrats go to young Naren 4S7NC for working no less than 198 stations in one massive pile up and also his great enthusiasm for experimenting with antennas.
